TECHNICAL TIP

The recessed spark plug holes in the Nash Ambassadore engine tend to collect grease. Sand and other debris can then readily fall into the motor when the spark plugs are Eventrally, some of this material becomes lodged in the threads making removal and installation difficult. The delicate threaded aluminum heads used in the Nash Healey are particularly prone to damage from this condition. This situation is easily Chrysler Corporation's famous prevented. slant six engine is equipped with similarly recessed spark plug holes and a set of ignition cables containing neoprene spark plug boots with a wide flange that seals the chamber against the entrance of extraneous matter. These Mopar ignition cable sets are readily available at auto parts and discount department stores. The boots slip off the wires and may then be substituted for those on your Nash Healey. Although the Mopar cables will not directly interchange with those on the Nash, some of them can be utilized with careful trimming. Not only do the boots keep the spark plug chambers clean but they look good too.
