

TECHNICAL TIPS

Replacement Gas Gauge Tank Unit

Many tank units could replace the original unit in your Nash Healey as did the Stewart Warner #One D-384C in my car. If you use the above drawing for a template to make an adapter plate, and follow the directions that come with the gauge unit, the job is a snap. To increase clearance for screw heads in the outer hole pattern, a file notch on the flange of the gauge at each of the six holes, is needed. A 3/8 inch rattail is what I used. The gasket for the tank unit was used to make the template, as noticed the oblong holes, but only a 1/8 or smaller hole is needed in the five places depending on the screw size available. I used No. 10 3/4 inch binding head sheet metal screws. The flange material could be anything you can cut up to 1/8 inch. I used 20 gauge tin. Good luck, and happy Healeying.

To restore the center grille emblem use a pin to remove the loose paint from the back side. (a toothpick might do). It isn't necessary to get all the black or red off, however, remove all the discolored chrome. repaint the red sections (Sherwin Williams "Chinese Red-5 years ago, now?) is a very close shade, let dry, then repaint the black and white letting each dry thoroughly before applying the other. Any paint that gets in the wrong place can be removed with fingernail polish remover (it doesn't affect the plastic) on a toothpick wrapped with cotton or a piece of kleenex. After all the paint is thoroughly dry use a good plastic cleaner to get the clear plastic completely clean.

Next, take a piece of heavy duty (Reynolds) aluminum foil, others probably work — anything handy in the kitchen, and cut it to the basic outline of the medallion. With your fingers, press the shiny side of the aluminum foil carefully into the grooves in the plastic. Smooth it down as far as possible without rubbing fingernails against it (they cause creases). Then, take an orangewood stick, used in clay modeling, and very carefully push the foil into the contours of the plastic. Any crinkles in the foil are erased by rubbing real hard.

Seal the back by putting strips of electrical tape over the back of the aluminum foil. This also fastens the foil to the plastic.

No doubt there is an easier or quicker way to repair the medallion but this makes a job that is near original. I doubt anyone could tell the difference and this method can't damage the emblem and is good until someone comes up with something better.

The above tip was sent to us from C. Nittinger of East Greenbush, New York. He restored his emblem five years ago, using this process, and it is still like new.
