My father signed a franchise with Nash Motors in the fall of 1941. By coincidence, the first car I ever owned was a 1941 Amb. Club Coupe.

In the fall of 1970 I bought and restored a 1941 Amb. Club Coupe. I drove it to the Nash Car Club of America Show at Kenosha, Wisconsin in the fall of 1971. My car placed second in its class.

Our dealership was too small to qualify for a Nash Healey when they came out, but I always admired them. The years passed by and my father suffered a heart attack in 1966. TECHNICAL NOTES:

Parts:

Chassis care:

Check your car: The front suspension puts a streaking stress on the chassis rails. Cracks develop behind the front suspension. Worst yet is that dirt and grease tend to hide them. Take some time and scrape away the dirt. Check the outside of the frame rail up to 6" behind the suspension attaching points; check the radiator mounting holes-sometimes the cracks run from them. I had this problem and several other club members have found the same trouble. You may have, and not know it. Check your car:

I took the shocks off my car and was able to match them up to a modern shock of the same size. The parts books of a good auto parts store will show them. I don't know exactly what it is for, but it fit fine, is very popular and fits some kind of recent Ford.

I am planning to have a new original wiring harness made for my '52 Roadster by a company in Rhode Island. The cost will be about \$250. They use original type wires, original type wire ends, original type lacing and original color coding. Their business is only auto wiring harnesses; if you want one for a '36 Packard... they have it in stock, '40 Chevrolet...same--in stock. I feel if there are any others who want harnesses, we can mitigate the cost somewhat by ordering together--let me know.

P.S. A wiring diagram is included in the copies of the shop manual that I have made available.


