TECH. NOTES

Carburator & Fuel flow

Gas Problems? With age the Nash Healey tanks are rusting on the inside. The tank is held up with two straps held by 8mm bolts through the trunk floor.

1) drain the tank. 2) remove tank and have it boiled out 3) clean out side and/or sandblast 4) paint outside 5) coat inside of tank with sloshing compound. Reinstall.

A few comments are in order. If you break the bolts taking the tank down, use a torch <u>after</u> the tank is out and remove the broken bolts. Then use a tap to clear the threads. You will probably find a pile of rust in the tank, this is of course the problem after cleaning the tank and getting out all the loose particles that you can. The sloshing compound that I used I got at an airport. The fuel tanks in aircrafts are regularly coated to keep the tanks clean. There are many tank coating compounds on the market - Look in Hemmings Motor News:

After the tank is reinstalled, an in-line fuel fifter is a good idea. If you want to keep it as original as possible try and find an old glass-bowl filter as might have been originally on the fuel pump.

CONSUMER BEWARE:

I have a horror story. Chroming is a labor intensive business. Each piece that is processed must go into the hands of eight-to-ten persons - each doing their own part. Now, if in that process something falls in a vat or into a bin or under a bench, you could almost accept the reality of that with existing labor conditions. (It is hard you say to lose something the size of a bumper...wait and see). This is not to say that there are not excellent people who are very careful... There are so I am told. Not knowing where to send my car, I used the old-car almanac published by Hemmings Motor News. I called Modern Plating in Newark, NJ. My first inkling of trouble was the receipt. "One let out parts" great! If he misplaces a piece, will he know? No way. Not even a number of pieces. Being ignorant. I assumed that this was standard procedure: which it is at Modern Plating in Newark, NJ, God help us: Well, the parts were promised for two weeks. Twelve weeks later I was told to go and get the parts. I found. eleven pieces. Forty-three were missing. PANIC. Two days later they found 42 more pieces stuck in a Corvair. I asked the foreman about the windshield frame that was still missing. I described the windshield frame in detail to him. He looked me straight in the eye and said he didn't know about it. Well I found out. This same foreman had mailed my windshield frame to another person in Virginia. Okay, you say a mix-up in records - wrong no records. No system.

Finished pieces, parts to be chromed litter the outer vestibule, and 3 out of 4 times I've been there, one could just walk into the vestibule. No locked door. It turns out that they do not keep records. Very cheap on filing cabinets. No filing cost.No files. They throw away all records. When a job is completed - no record of the transaction.

The quality of the work varied from passable to poor to really not acceptable, but would you leave the parts with people like this so they could get another crack at losing them?

The following are items decided on:

- 1) The directors discussed the direction that the club should take. It was decided that the club should begin to stock and sell parts so as to facilitate the maintenance and repair of Nash Healey cars.
- 2) The subscription rate for 1978 and 1979 will be \$9.00 per year a note about subscriptions: they are run on a calendar year January to December no matter when you join. If you join in the middle of a year you will get all of that years issues.
- 3) The club will begin to stock tail-light and signal lenses and make them available. This is the beginning of what is hoped to be a long list of needed parts.
